<u>Sunday</u>: Pray for the joy of the resurrection among us; for the fruit of faith nourished by the Word and Sacraments.

Monday: Pray for faith to live in the promises of Holy Baptism; for one's calling and daily work; for the unemployed; for the salvation and well-being of our neighbors; for schools, colleges, and seminaries; for good government and for peace.

<u>Tuesday</u>: Pray for deliverance against temptation and evil; for the addicted and despairing, the tortured and oppressed; for those struggling with besetting sins.

Wednesday: Pray for marriage and family, that husbands and wives, parents and children live in ordered harmony according to the Word of God; for parents who must raise children alone; for our communities and neighborhoods.

<u>Thursday</u>: Pray for the Church and her pastors; for teachers, deacons, deaconesses, and other church workers; for missionaries and for all who serve the Church; for fruitful and salutary use of the blessed sacrament of Christ's body and blood.

<u>Friday</u>: Pray for the preaching of the holy cross of our Lord Jesus Christ and for the spread of His knowledge throughout the whole world; for the persecuted and oppressed; for the sick and dying.

Saturday: Pray for faithfulness to the end; for the renewal of those who are withering in the faith or have fallen away; for receptive hearts and minds to God's Word on the Lord's Day; for pastors and people as they prepare to administer and receive Christ's holy gifts.

And yet, He bids us not to cling to Him until He has ascended. Indeed, He shall ascend to the Father, and all those who serve Him and call upon his name shall cleave unto him, and ascend with Him unto His Father and Our Father, unto His God and Our God.

Read the Scriptures appointed for the day, review the readings from Sunday, and learn by heart the appointed verse and portion of the Small Catechism. Conclude with the Psalms, the Collect, and the prayers, using the guidelines as you see appropriate.

A LOOK BACK TO THE LITURGY – APRIL 19, 2020

Theme: Let us cling unto our Lord as He ascends unto the Father.

Hymn: 467, "Awake, My Heart, with Gladness"

Summary of Readings:

Exodus 14:10–15:1: The Lord delivers the Israelites out of the land of Egypt through the Red Sea, destroying the Egyptians, prefiguring Christ's destruction of our bondage to sin through Holy Baptism.

1 Corinthians 15:1-11: St. Paul encourages the Church to remember the foundation and creed of their faith: Christ died for our sins, was buried, and was raised on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. This is the Gospel. Indeed, *this is most certainly true*.

John 20:1–18: Christ rises from the dead, and bids Mary Magdalene not to cling to Him yet, but to wait unto he has ascended unto the Father. She is then instructed to tell the disciples about His resurrection and His words.

MEMORY VERSE TO LEARN BY HEART:

Ephesians 2:1: "You He made alive, who were dead in trespasses and sins."

THE CATECHISM: THE APOSTLE'S CREED: SECOND ARTICLE

(Important! If you have memorized a different translation in confirmation, it is best to pull out your old catechism and refresh your memory from those texts.)

The Second Article: Redemption

And in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried. He descended into hell. The third day He rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of God the Father Almighty. From thence He will come to judge the living and the dead.

PSALM OF THE WEEK: PSALM 118:15-29 (ESV)

Meditate on this Psalm every day when you pray, and use it as the starting place for your own prayer:

does valiantly, ¹⁶the right hand of the LORD exalts, the right hand of the LORD does valiantly!" ¹⁷I shall not die, but I shall live, and recount the deeds of the LORD. ¹⁸The LORD has disciplined me severely, but he has not given me over to death. ¹⁹Open to me the gates of righteousness, that I may enter through them and give thanks to the LORD. ²⁰This is the gate of the LORD; the righteous shall enter through it. ²¹I thank you that you have answered me and have become my salvation. ²²The stone that the builders rejected has become the cornerstone. ²³This is the LORD's doing; it is marvelous in our eyes. ²⁴This is the day that the LORD has made; let us rejoice and be glad in it. ²⁵Save us, we pray, O LORD! O LORD, we pray, give us success! ²⁶Blessed is he who comes in the name of the LORD! We bless you from the house of the LORD. ²⁷The LORD is God, and he has made his light to shine upon us. Bind the festal sacrifice with cords, up to the horns of the altar! ²⁸You are my God, and I will give thanks to you; you are my God; I will extol you. ²⁹Oh give thanks to the LORD, for he is good; for his steadfast love endures forever!

LUTHER'S PRAYER ON PSALM 1181:

Lord Jesus, who bled and died for our sins, and rose again triumphing over Your and our enemies, grant us to be partakers of Your victory, that we, delivered from the hand of them that hate us, may serve You without fear in time and eternity. Amen.

COLLECT FOR THE FEAST OF THE RESURRECTION OF OUR LORD:

Almighty God, through Your only-begotten Son, Jesus Christ, You overcame death and opened to us the gate of everlasting life. We humbly pray that we may live before You in righteousness and purity forever; through the same Jesus Christ, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.
