

A Guide for your Christian Life between Sundays

The Feast of the Holy Trinity June 7 through June 13, 2020

Throughout the entire Bible, God gives us not just one name or title for Himself, but manifold numbers of names, different names describing different attributes of who He is, so that we might know Him deeper, and we might call upon Him in time of need. Yet the Bible also assures us that these many names are still at the same time one great name for the One True God. On Trinity Sunday, we celebrate Christ's victory in keeping the name of God in Christ free from stain and heresy throughout the ages, and guarding the faith against its enemies.

AN ORDER FOR DAILY MEDITATION AND PRAYER

Read the Scriptures appointed for the day, review the readings from Sunday, and learn by heart the appointed verse and portion of the Small Catechism. Conclude with the Psalms, the Collect, and the prayers, using the guidelines as you see appropriate.

A LOOK BACK TO THE LITURGY – JUNE 7, 2020

Theme: On Trinity Sunday, we celebrate Christ's continuing victory over all the enemies of the Church not just in the past, but until the Last Day.

Hymn: 507, "Holy, Holy, Holy"

Summary of Readings:

Genesis 1:1—2:4a: The Lord creates the heavens and the earth, and all that is in it in six days, completing His creation by forming man in His image.

Acts 2:14a, 22–36: St. Peter preaches the Gospel of Christ's death and resurrection in the city of Jerusalem.

Matthew 28:16–20: Christ gives His final command to the Apostles, that as they go, they preach the Gospel, teaching all that was taught to them, and baptizing in the Trinitarian name.

MEMORY VERSE TO LEARN BY HEART:

Matthew 28:19-20: "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age."

THE CATECHISM: THE LORD'S PRAYER: SECOND PETITION I

(Important! If you have memorized a different translation in confirmation, it is best to pull out your old catechism and refresh your memory from those texts.)

Thy kingdom come.

What does this mean? The kingdom of God certainly comes by itself without our prayer, but we pray in this petition that it may come to us also.

PSALM OF THE WEEK: PSALM 8 (ESV)

Meditate on this Psalm every day when you pray, and use it as the starting place for your own prayer:

¹O LORD, our Lord, how majestic is your name in all the earth! You have set your glory above the heavens. ²Out of the mouth of babes and infants, you have established strength because of your foes, to still the enemy and the avenger. ³When I look at your heavens, the work of your fingers, the moon and the stars, which you have set in place, ⁴what is man that you are mindful of him, and the son of man that you care for him? ⁵Yet you have made him a little lower than the heavenly beings and crowned him with glory and honor. ⁶You have given him dominion over the works of your hands; you have put all things under his feet, ⁷all sheep and oxen, and also the beasts of the field, ⁸the birds of the heavens, and the fish of the sea, whatever passes along the paths of the seas. ⁹O LORD, our Lord, how majestic is your name in all the earth!

LUTHER'S PRAYER ON PSALM 81:

Lord Jesus, You were delivered for our offenses and raised again for our justification. Bless and defend Your Holy Church. Endue Your Word with power, strengthen our faith, and after the sufferings of this life grant us to celebrate a happy Easter, rising again to live and reign with You in all eternity. Amen.

COLLECT FOR THE FEAST OF THE HOLY TRINITY:

Almighty and everlasting God, You have given us grace to acknowledge the glory of the eternal Trinity by the confession of a true faith and to worship the Unity in the power of the Divine Majesty. Keep us steadfast in this faith and defend us from all adversities; for You, O Father, Son and Holy Spirit, live and reign, one God, now and forever. Amen.

DAILY THEMES FOR PRAYER – (From LSB page 294)

- <u>Sunday</u>: Pray for the joy of the resurrection among us; for the fruit of faith nourished by the Word and Sacraments.

- <u>Wednesday</u>: Pray for marriage and family, that husbands and wives, parents and children live in ordered harmony according to the Word of God; for parents who must raise children alone; for our communities and neighborhoods.
- <u>Thursday</u>: Pray for the Church and her pastors; for teachers, deacons, deaconesses, and other church workers; for missionaries and for all who serve the Church; for fruitful and salutary use of the blessed sacrament of Christ's body and blood.
- <u>Friday</u>: Pray for the preaching of the holy cross of our Lord Jesus Christ and for the spread of His knowledge throughout the whole world; for the persecuted and oppressed; for the sick and dying.
- <u>Saturday</u>: Pray for faithfulness to the end; for the renewal of those who are withering in the faith or have fallen away; for receptive hearts and minds to God's Word on the Lord's Day; for pastors and people as they prepare to administer and receive Christ's holy gifts.
