

The Second Sunday after the Epiphany January 16 through January 22, 2022

Jesus gives as His first miracle the turning of water into wine at a wedding in Cana. Though this is perhaps Jesus' most humble miracle, it is considered by John the most important, for in it is given the substance of Christ's entire ministry: the joining of God and man in marriage on the third day, the day of our redemption. For in the Incarnation, there is a marriage between the divine nature and the human nature in the person of Jesus. Similarly, in the body and blood given for us in Christ's Passion, we are wedded to the Son of God as our bridegroom. Finally, in death, we will gather into the 'marriage feast which will have no end' and so forever be wedded to God in an unending and joyous 'day,' a morning which will never see night.

AN ORDER FOR DAILY MEDITATION AND PRAYER

Read the Scriptures appointed for the day, review the readings from Sunday, and learn by heart the appointed verse and portion of the Small Catechism. Conclude with the Psalms, the Collect, and the prayers, using the guidelines as you see appropriate.

DAILY READINGS FOR THE WEEK

A LOOK BACK TO THE LITURGY – JANUARY 16, 2022

Theme: Mankind is married to God through the wine of Christ's blood, shed for us for the forgiveness of our sins, and for our unending joy.

Hymn: 636, "Soul, Adorn Yourself with Gladness"

Summary of Readings:

Isaiah 62:1-15: God pledges to redeem Israel and marry her to himself, prospering her forever, and bringing her forth in righteousness.

1 Corinthians 12:1-11: Paul teaches that the primary gift of the Spirit is that we, the baptized, are able to pronounce in truth that 'Jesus is Lord.' Yet besides this greatest gift, there are other gifts given to some for the sake of the Church, that she might always be instructed and never die.

John 2:1-11: Jesus turns water into wine at wedding in the town of Cana, thus initiating His earthly ministry by this sign, which designates His entire ministry as the fulfillment of His betrothal to Israel.

MEMORY VERSE TO LEARN BY HEART:

Mark 10:7-9: "A man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two shall be one flesh. Therefore what God has joined together, let no man tear asunder."

THE CATECHISM: THE LORD'S PRAYER: SECOND PETITION II

(Important! If you have memorized a different translation in confirmation, it is best to pull out your old catechism and refresh your memory from those texts.)

Thy kingdom come.

How does God's kingdom come? God's kingdom comes when our heavenly Father gives us His Holy Spirit, so that by His grace we believe His holy Word and lead godly lives here in time and there in eternity.

PSALM OF THE WEEK: PSALM 128 (ESV)

Meditate on this Psalm every day when you pray, and use it as the starting place for your own prayer:

¹Blessed is everyone who fears the LORD, who walks in his ways!

 2 You shall eat the fruit of the labor of your hands; you shall be blessed, and it shall be well with you.

³Your wife will be like a fruitful vine within your house; your children will be like olive shoots around your table.

⁴Behold, thus shall the man be blessed who fears the LORD.

⁵The LORD bless you from Zion! May you see the prosperity of Jerusalem all the days of your life!

⁶May you see your children's children! Peace be upon Israel

LUTHER'S PRAYER ON PSALM 128¹:

Thanks be to You, our God, for instituting the holy estate of matrimony and preserving it for so many ages against the assaults of that apostate spirit which is an enemy of all that is pure and godly. Make every house Your temple. Fashion the hearts of husband and wife to love children, and cause both parents and children to walk in the faith of Your Son, and be saved. Amen.

COLLECT FOR THE SECOND SUNDAY AFTER THE EPIPHANY:

Almighty and everlasting God, who governs all things in heaven and on earth, mercifully hear the prayers of Your people and grant us Your peace through all our days; through Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

- <u>Saturday</u>: Pray for faithfulness to the end; for the renewal of those who are withering in the faith or have fallen away; for receptive hearts and minds to God's Word on the Lord's Day; for pastors and people as they prepare to administer and receive Christ's holy gifts.
