The Feast of the Transfiguration of Our Lord March 2 through March 8, 2025

In His Transfiguration, Our Lord reveals Himself to our mortal minds in the fullness of who He is. Though man, yet He shines with divine glory, being Himself man assumed into the Godhead. There He speaks with Moses and Elijah, the Law and the Prophets, who spoke of Him; and He speaks of His 'exodus' for in dying for the sins of the world, and leading the redeemed into the heavenly mansions, He shall accomplish in truth what Moses did in shadow.

AN ORDER FOR DAILY MEDITATION AND PRAYER

Read the Scriptures appointed for the day, review the readings from Sunday, and learn by heart the appointed verse and portion of the Small Catechism. Conclude with the Psalms, the Collect, and the prayers, using the guidelines as you see appropriate.

DAILY READINGS FOR THE WEEK

A LOOK BACK TO THE LITURGY - MARCH 2, 2025

Theme: In His Transfiguration, Christ shows us who He truly is, and what He has come to fulfill.

Hymn: 413, "O Wondrous Type! O Vision Fair"

Summary of Readings:

Deuteronomy 34:1–12: The death of the greatest of the prophets, Moses, is described, and Joshua takes charge of the Israelites.

Hebrews 3:1–6: The author of Hebrews shows Christ as the true and greater Moses, for Moses did what it was that God had prepared for him to do, but Christ does the will of His Father for the salvation of all mankind. Therefore, let us hold fast to our faith in Christ, and we shall be saved, even as the Hebrews were saved by Moses.

Luke 9:28–36: Our Lord Christ is transfigured into an indescribable radiance, and He converses with Moses and Elijah about His coming Passion. The Father, again, declares him His Chosen One.

MEMORY VERSE TO LEARN BY HEART:

Colossians 1:13-14: "He has delivered us from the domain of darkness and transferred us to the kingdom of His beloved Son, in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins."

THE CATECHISM: THE LORD'S PRAYER: SECOND PETITION (PART 1)

(Important! If you have memorized a different translation in confirmation, it is best to pull out your old catechism and refresh your memory from those texts.)

Thy kingdom come.

What does this mean? The kingdom of God certainly comes by itself without our prayer, but we pray in this petition that it may come to us also.

PSALM OF THE WEEK: PSALM 99 (ESV)

Meditate on this Psalm every day when you pray, and use it as the starting place for your own prayer:

¹The LORD reigns; let the peoples tremble! He sits enthroned upon the cherubim; let the earth quake! ²The LORD is great in Zion; he is exalted over all the peoples. ³Let them praise your great and awesome name! Holy is he! ⁴The King in his might loves justice. You have established equity; you have executed justice and righteousness in Jacob. ⁵Exalt the LORD our God; worship at his footstool! Holy is he! ⁶Moses and Aaron were among his priests, Samuel also was among those who called upon his name. They called to the LORD, and he answered them. ⁷In the pillar of the cloud he spoke to them; they kept his testimonies and the statute that he gave them. ⁸O LORD our God, you answered them; you were a forgiving God to them, but an avenger of their wrongdoings. ⁹Exalt the LORD our God, and worship at his holy mountain; for the LORD our God is holy!

LUTHER'S PRAYER ON PSALM 99¹:

Lord Jesus, be our Guide and our Defense in this evil world, that we may never be ashamed to confess You before men, but may serve You in holy conversation and constant fidelity. Restrain the evil counsels of those who set themselves against You and Your Church, and cause them to see the evil of their ways, that they may be turned to You. Amen.

COLLECT FOR THE FEAST OF THE TRANSFIGURATION OF OUR LORD:

O God, in the glorious Transfiguration of Your beloved Son You confirmed the mysteries of the faith by the testimony of Moses and Elijah. In the voice that came from the bright cloud You wonderfully foreshowed our adoption by grace. Mercifully make us co-heirs with the King of His glory and bring us to the fullness of our inheritance in heaven; through the same Jesus Christ, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

DAILY THEMES FOR PRAYER – (From LSB page 294)

- <u>Friday</u>: Pray for the preaching of the holy cross of our Lord Jesus Christ and for the spread of His knowledge throughout the whole world; for the persecuted and oppressed; for the sick and dying.
- <u>Saturday</u>: Pray for faithfulness to the end; for the renewal of those who are withering in the faith or have fallen away; for receptive hearts and minds to God's Word on the Lord's Day; for pastors and people as they prepare to administer and receive Christ's holy gifts.
