



A Guide for your Christian Life between Sundays

*The Seventh Sunday of Easter
June 1 through June 7, 2025*

Jesus prays for His disciples of all ages, that we might be ‘one’ with one another, but also that we might be ‘one’ with God. He says that we will be one as we share in Jesus’ glory. What is His glory? Well, it is everything that Jesus has, both what we would like, and what we would not like. For Jesus’ glory contains a lot of what we don’t like: suffering, loss, sadness, misery, and ultimately, death. But that is not all. Jesus’ glory ultimately promises us forgiveness, power, majesty, eternal life, and dominion over all creation. The unbelieving world laughs at Christ’s glory now in this life, for it only looks like unnecessary suffering, but they will not be laughing when they see what that glory has become in the Life of the World to come. We pray that that Eternal Life in the New Heavens and the New Earth comes soon, and so we pray ‘*Amen, come Lord Jesus.*’

AN ORDER FOR DAILY MEDITATION AND PRAYER

Read the Scriptures appointed for the day, review the readings from Sunday, and learn by heart the appointed verse and portion of the Small Catechism. Conclude with the Psalms, the Collect, and the prayers, using the guidelines as you see appropriate.

A LOOK BACK TO THE LITURGY – JUNE 1, 2025

Theme: The glory of Jesus which unites all believers to each other and to God is found in our suffering, in our sanctification, and ultimately in our being with Christ and ruling with Him forever.

Hymn: 539, “Christ Is the World’s Redeemer”

Summary of Readings:

Acts 1:9-26: The eleven Apostles, united in Christ by His Word and His commission to preach to the nations, select Matthias to take the place of Judas in the Office of the Holy Ministry by which Christ’s glory will be revealed for the life of the world.

Revelation 22:1-6, 12-20: Jesus sends His angels, His messengers, to reveal His glory to the nations and make known the way that leads to life. Idolaters will remain outside, apart from God and His blessings, while those who bear His Name through Baptism and make their robes clean in His blood will be united as one with Him to reign forever and ever.

John 17:20-26: Jesus, just prior to revealing the fullness of God’s Glory on the Cross, prays for His Apostles and all who would be united with them through their Word, that we would all be one in Christ with the Father, restored to the relationship with God for which we were created.

MEMORY VERSE TO LEARN BY HEART:

Acts 2:38-39: “Repent and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins, and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. For the promise is for you and for your children.”

THE CATECHISM: BAPTISM (PART 4)

(Important! If you have memorized a different translation in confirmation, it is best to pull out your old catechism and refresh your memory from those texts.)

Titus 3:5-8: “He saved us through the washing of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit, whom He poured out on us generously through Jesus Christ our Savior, so that, having been justified by His grace, we might become heirs having the hope of eternal life. This is a trustworthy saying.”

PSALM OF THE WEEK: PSALM 133 (ESV)

Meditate on this Psalm every day when you pray, and use it as the starting place for your own prayer:

¹Behold, how good and pleasant it is when brothers dwell in unity! ²It is like the precious oil on the head, running down on the beard, on the beard of Aaron, running down on the collar of his robes! ³It is like the dew of Hermon, which falls on the mountains of Zion! For there the LORD has commanded the blessing, life forevermore.

LUTHER’S PRAYER ON PSALM 133¹:

Lord Jesus, You who are our Peace with the Father, because by Your blood You have reconciled us to Him, grant and preserve peace in Church and State, and teach us who dwell under the same roof to be of one heart and one mind. Remove from us all envy and strife, and let Your peace dwell in our hearts that we may live and die in peace. Amen.

COLLECT FOR THE SEVENTH SUNDAY OF EASTER:

O King of glory, Lord of hosts, uplifted in triumph far above all heavens, leave us not without consolation but send us the Spirit of truth whom You promised from the Father; for You live and reign with Him and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

DAILY THEMES FOR PRAYER – (From LSB page 294)

Sunday: Pray for the joy of the resurrection among us; for the fruit of faith nourished by the Word and Sacraments.

Friday: Pray for the preaching of the holy cross of our Lord Jesus Christ and for the spread of His knowledge throughout the whole world; for the persecuted and oppressed; for the sick and dying.

Saturday: Pray for faithfulness to the end; for the renewal of those who are withering in the faith or have fallen away; for receptive hearts and minds to God's Word on the Lord's Day; for pastors and people as they prepare to administer and receive Christ's holy gifts.
