



## A Guide for your Christian Life between Sundays

*The Feast of St. Michael & All Angels  
September 28 through October 4, 2025*

The name 'Michael' means 'Who is like God?' It asks the question of who God is, and what gods are. The ancient pagans believed the gods to be representations of the forces that people are powerless against, all those things that, no-matter how hard we try, we cannot free ourselves from: things like love and hatred and money. People back then were no less pagan than people today, who still worship these gods, and are still powerless against them. The Lord God commands His angels to free His people from slavery to these so-called gods, these idols, that we may submit ourselves to nothing in creation, but to the Uncreated God alone.

*Read the Scriptures appointed for the day, review the readings from Sunday, and learn by heart the appointed verse and portion of the Small Catechism. Conclude with the Psalms, the Collect, and the prayers, using the guidelines as you see appropriate.*

## A LOOK BACK TO THE LITURGY – SEPTEMBER 28, 2025

**Theme:** The Christian never fights against Satan alone, but with Christ, the Church, and the Holy Angels, that we might be free from our slavery to the idols.

**Hymn:** 521, “Christ, the Lord of Hosts, Unshaken”

### Summary of Readings:

**Daniel 10:10-14, 12:1-3:** Daniel receives a prophecy concerning the guardianship of the Archangel Michael.

**Revelation 12:7-12:** St. John describes the battle in heaven between St. Michael and the angels against the devil and his fallen angels, and how Satan and his host were cast out of heaven onto the earth.

**Luke: 10:17-20:** The Seventy-Two return to Christ, rejoicing that they were able to cast out demons in the name of Jesus. Jesus reminds them not to rejoice in the power they have received through Him, but rather to rejoice in their salvation.

### MEMORY VERSE TO LEARN BY HEART:

**Romans 1:16a:** “I am not ashamed of the gospel, for it is the power of God for salvation to everyone who believes.”

## **THE CATECHISM: THE 3<sup>RD</sup> COMMANDMENT**

*(Important! If you have memorized a different translation in confirmation, it is best to pull out your old catechism and refresh your memory from those texts.)*

*What is the Third Commandment? Remember the Sabbath day by keeping it holy.*

*What does this mean? We should fear and love God so that we do not despise preaching and His Word, but hold it sacred and gladly hear and learn it.*

### **PSALM OF THE WEEK: PSALM 91 (ESV)**

*Meditate on this Psalm every day when you pray, and use it as the starting place for your own prayer:*

<sup>1</sup>He who dwells in the shelter of the Most High will abide in the shadow of the Almighty. <sup>2</sup>I will say to the LORD, “My refuge and my fortress, my God, in whom I trust.” <sup>3</sup>For he will deliver you from the snare of the fowler and from the deadly pestilence. <sup>4</sup>He will cover you with his pinions, and under his wings you will find refuge; his faithfulness is a shield and buckler. <sup>5</sup>You will not fear the terror of the night, nor the arrow that flies by day, <sup>6</sup>nor the pestilence that stalks in darkness, nor the destruction that wastes at noonday. <sup>7</sup>A thousand may fall at your side, ten thousand at your right hand, but it will not come near you. <sup>8</sup>You will only look with your eyes and see the recompense of the wicked. <sup>9</sup>Because you have made the LORD your dwelling place—the Most High, who is my refuge— <sup>10</sup>no evil shall be allowed to befall you, no plague come near your tent. <sup>11</sup>For he will command his angels concerning you to guard you in all your ways. <sup>12</sup>On their hands they will bear you up, lest you strike your foot against a stone. <sup>13</sup>You will tread on the lion and the adder; the young lion and the serpent you will trample underfoot. <sup>14</sup>“Because he holds fast to me in love, I will deliver him; I will protect him, because he knows my name. <sup>15</sup>When he calls to me, I will answer him; I will be with him in trouble; I will rescue him and honor him. <sup>16</sup>With long life I will satisfy him and show him my salvation.”

### **LUTHER’S PRAYER ON PSALM 91<sup>1</sup>:**

Lord Jesus Christ, the Author and Finisher of faith, grant us the true and saving faith, and preserve us in the same against all temptations to doubt and unbelief. Blot out our iniquities by Your blood; cover our sins with Your righteousness, and let Your angels be a fenced wall around us against all our enemies, and evermore teach us to know the secret of Your Father’s will. Amen.

### **COLLECT FOR THE FEAST OF ST. MICHAEL & ALL ANGELS:**

Everlasting God, You have ordained and constituted the service of angels and men in a wonderful order. Mercifully grant that, as Your holy angels always serve and worship You in heaven, so by Your appointment they may also help and defend us here on earth; through Your Son, Jesus Christ, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

## **DAILY THEMES FOR PRAYER – (From LSB page 294)**

Sunday: Pray for the joy of the resurrection among us; for the fruit of faith nourished by the Word and Sacraments.

Friday: Pray for the preaching of the holy cross of our Lord Jesus Christ and for the spread of His knowledge throughout the whole world; for the persecuted and oppressed; for the sick and dying.

Saturday: Pray for faithfulness to the end; for the renewal of those who are withering in the faith or have fallen away; for receptive hearts and minds to God's Word on the Lord's Day; for pastors and people as they prepare to administer and receive Christ's holy gifts.
