God is Holy, and entirely set apart from us, and this is true. Yet we are wrong to think that this means that we are far off from Him, for He has always desired to be near us. Yet through our sins, we have for thousands of years wandered farther and farther off. How then is it possible for us to approach a holy God? Well, simply put, we must become holy. Yet how are sinful men to become Holy? On this feast of Pentecost, that question is answered, for God has poured out His Holy Spirit upon the Church, that it might dwell in us through His Word and Sacrament, and we may be brought into the perfectly Holy God.

*Read the Scriptures appointed for the day, review the readings from Sunday, and learn by heart the appointed verse and portion of the Small Catechism. Conclude with the Psalms, the Collect, and the prayers, using the guidelines as you see appropriate.*

### A LOOK BACK TO THE LITURGY – MAY 24, 2026

**Theme:** Through the gift of the Holy Spirit, we are made Holy, that we may come to God.

**Hymn:** 497, “Come, Holy Ghost, God and Lord”

#### Summary of Readings:

**Numbers 11:24–30:** God pours out His Spirit upon the seventy that He has summoned, and they prophesy for a time. Two continue to prophesy and some come to Moses to accuse them, but Moses rebukes them, saying that he wishes that all were prophets.

**Acts 2:1–21:** On the Feast of Pentecost, the Lord pours forth His Spirit upon His Apostles, and they speak in many tongues, that all might hear the Gospel, and so be saved.

**John 7:37–39:** Jesus prophesies about the giving of the Holy Spirit.

### THE CATECHISM —BAPTISM (PT. 6)

*(Important! If you have memorized a different translation in confirmation, it is best to pull out your old catechism and refresh your memory from those texts.)*

*Where is this written?* St. Paul writes in Romans chapter six: “We were therefore buried with Him through baptism into death in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a new life.” (Romans 6:4)

## **MEMORY VERSE TO LEARN BY HEART:**

**Ephesians 4:24:** “Put on the new self, created after the likeness of God in true righteousness and holiness.”

## **PSALM OF THE WEEK: PSALM 25 (ESV)**

*Meditate on this Psalm every day when you pray, and use it as the starting place for your own prayer:*

<sup>1</sup>To you, O LORD, I lift up my soul. <sup>2</sup>O my God, in you I trust; let me not be put to shame; let not my enemies exult over me. <sup>3</sup>Indeed, none who wait for you shall be put to shame; they shall be ashamed who are wantonly treacherous. <sup>4</sup>Make me to know your ways, O LORD; teach me your paths. <sup>5</sup>Lead me in your truth and teach me, for you are the God of my salvation; for you I wait all the day long. <sup>6</sup>Remember your mercy, O LORD, and your steadfast love, for they have been from of old. <sup>7</sup>Remember not the sins of my youth or my transgressions; according to your steadfast love remember me, for the sake of your goodness, O LORD! <sup>8</sup>Good and upright is the LORD; therefore he instructs sinners in the way. <sup>9</sup>He leads the humble in what is right, and teaches the humble his way. <sup>10</sup>All the paths of the LORD are steadfast love and faithfulness, for those who keep his covenant and his testimonies. <sup>11</sup>For your name's sake, O LORD, pardon my guilt, for it is great. <sup>12</sup>Who is the man who fears the LORD? Him will he instruct in the way that he should choose. <sup>13</sup>His soul shall abide in well-being, and his offspring shall inherit the land. <sup>14</sup>The friendship of the LORD is for those who fear him, and he makes known to them his covenant. <sup>15</sup>My eyes are ever toward the LORD, for he will pluck my feet out of the net.

## **LUTHER'S PREFACE TO PSALM 25<sup>1</sup>:**

Thanks and praise be unto You, God of all grace, because You have delivered our souls from the bondage of Satan, and have saved us through the Red Sea of the blood of Your Son, Jesus Christ, our Savior. Cleanse us evermore with His blood that, with all Your saints, we may continually praise You. Amen.

## **COLLECT FOR THE FEAST OF PENTECOST:**

O God, on this day You once taught the hearts of Your faithful people by sending them the light of Your Holy Spirit. Grant us in our day by the same Spirit to have a right understanding in all things and evermore to rejoice in His holy consolation; through Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

## **DAILY THEMES FOR PRAYER – (From LSB page 294)**

Sunday: Pray for the joy of the resurrection among us; for the fruit of faith nourished by the Word and Sacraments.

Thursday: Pray for the Church and her pastors; for teachers, deacons, deaconesses, and other church workers; for missionaries and for all who serve the Church; for fruitful and salutary use of the blessed sacrament of Christ's body and blood.

Friday: Pray for the preaching of the holy cross of our Lord Jesus Christ and for the spread of His knowledge throughout the whole world; for the persecuted and oppressed; for the sick and dying.

Saturday: Pray for faithfulness to the end; for the renewal of those who are withering in the faith or have fallen away; for receptive hearts and minds to God's Word on the Lord's Day; for pastors and people as they prepare to administer and receive Christ's holy gifts.
